What is Title I?

Oak Hill Middle School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Oak Hill Middle School will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Oak Hill Middle School values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Oak Hill Middle School will support parent engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Oak Hill Middle School invited all parents to provide input and suggestions through a survey last spring to review and revise this parental involvement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact and the parental involvement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year. The plan is posted on our School and District Websites for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. Parents can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Oak Hill Middle School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is distributed to all students. The plan will also be posted on the school website. Parents may request a copy of the plan in the front office of the school.

2025-2026 School Goals

Oak Hill Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the developing/above levels on the EOG in all subject areas by 3% in each grade from the previous school year by the end of the current school year.

Focus Areas

The academic focus area for the 2025-2028 school year will be student achievement. Oak Hill Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the developing/above levels on the EOG in all content areas by 3% for the next three consecutive years.

Oak Hill Middle School will decrease the percentage of students receiving office referrals by 5% from the previous school year.

Oak Hill Middle School will decrease the percentage of students missing 18 or more days of school by 5% from the previous school year by the end of the 2025-2026 school year.

Oak Hill Middle School will increase the community partnerships by 1% each school year.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Oak Hill Middle School and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the School Forum. The school-parent compacts are sent home with each child.

Oak Hill Middle School will host the following events, among others, to build the capacity for strong parental involvement to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement. All meetings for parents will be held in the evening at 5:30 p.m. unless otherwise noted.
