What is Title I?

Oak Hill Middle School, as well as Baldwin County School District, is identified as a Title I School/District as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). What is it?

This is a plan that describes how OHMS will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement in order to support student learning. How is it revised?

OHMS will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English abilities, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is distributed to all students. The plan will also be posted on the school website. Parents may request a copy of the plan in the front office of the school.

2018-2019 District Goals

All students will reach high standards at a minimum attaining proficiency or better in reading/language arts and mathematics on the state assessment.

2017-2018 School Goals

On the 2017-2018 CCRPI Report, OHMS will increase the percentage of students scoring as Developing Learner or Above on the GA Milestones exam by 3% from the previous year in each grade level while specifically focusing on math and literacy initiatives.
